Service Projects!

Evelyn Bennett and Blair Bramlett: What was your experience like with the service projects? **Michelle Koch:** They were a big success...Preschool, kindergarten, 1st grade, and 2nd grade helped fill buckets for Jerico's Way, 3rd and 4th grade collected items for an I.C. church ministry called Martha's Kitchen, and 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th grade collected items for the Van, which helps to support homeless people in Central Arkansas.

EB & BB: Can you explain what the service projects are and are about?

MK: Jericho's Way is an organization that...helps to provide items like toilet paper, paper towels, and cleaning supplies for the homeless population after they are able to be put into apartments or housing. Those things can be very expensive so it helps to start them with those. The Van collects items like thick winter socks and hand warmers, as well as personal size toiletries, that can be provided to the homeless here in Central Arkansas.

Martha's Kitchen is a ministry here at the church that provides a meal once a month to different community centers and homeless shelters that they prepare at I.C. and then take to a center, usually Jericho's Way.

EB & BB: Why are they important?

MK: Service projects are important, because they help encourage our students and families to give back to the community and participate to support those in need.

EB & BB: How much money and products were collected from these projects?

MK: We helped to stock 2 self serve pantries... Preschool supported two of those stand alone pantries, then we filled an entire SUV to have items to prepare that large meal to be dropped off up at the drop off location, and we filled the whole cabinet [at the location].

EB & BB: Who are some people who helped with the projects?

MK: All the students helped collect items, the teachers helped remind students to collect items in their classrooms, and the student government picked up the items in the hallway, then Mrs. Koch dropped them off to local organizations.

We had monetary donations sent in... [totaling] around 300 dollars to The Van and Martha's Kitchen and Jericho's Way.

EB & BB: Jericho's Way (K-2nd project) gave cupcakes to K-2nd grade February 27, 2025. **MK:** A Jericho's Way's representative wanted to come in and thank the students for all their donations and support, so they asked to come in to thank the kids personally and give them a little treat.

All of these organizations are extremely appreciative of the support. Martha's Kitchen and Jericho's Way rely on schools like ours to continue to serve the homeless population in Central Arkansas.


74.8% of the people at I.C. prefer the beach. 25.2% of people at I.C. prefer the snow.
